Annelies Marie Frank:

(Born 12 June 1929 – Died, February or March 1945) was a German-born diarist and writer.

She is one of the most discussed Jewish victims of the Holocaust. Her diary, *The Diary of a Young Girl*, which documents her life in hiding during the German occupation of the Netherlands in World War II, is one of the world's most widely known books and has been the basis for several plays and films.



Born in the city of Frankfurt, Germany, she lived most of her life in or near Amsterdam, the Netherlands. Born a German national, Frank lost her citizenship in 1941 and thus became stateless. The Frank family moved from Germany to Amsterdam in the early 1930s when the Nazis gained control over Germany. By May 1940, they were trapped in Amsterdam by the German occupation of the Netherlands.

As persecutions of the Jewish population increased in July 1942, the family went into hiding in some concealed rooms behind a bookcase in the building where Anne's father worked. In August 1944, the group was betrayed and transported to concentration camps.

Anne and her sister, Margot, were eventually transferred to Bergen-Belsen concentration camp, where they died (probably of typhus) in February or March 1945, just weeks before the camp was liberated in April.

Otto Frank, the only survivor of the family, returned to Amsterdam after the war to find that Anne's diary had been saved by one of the helpers, Miep Gies, and his efforts led to its publication in 1947.

It was translated from its original Dutch version and first published in English in 1952 as *The Diary of a Young Girl*, and has since been translated into over 60 languages.

The diary, which was given to Anne on her thirteenth birthday, chronicles her life from 12 June 1942 until 1 August 1944.



Connor Scoble: Mr. Frank

Connor has been performing since as long as he can remember, whether appearing on stage for arts projects in primary school, or singing really horribly to anyone who would listen, as a child. Entertaining has always been his one true passion. After training with Triple Threat Academy for a year, he has been able to perform for shows in amateur productions such as 2015's Beauty and the Beast, and Legally Blonde, as well as starring as Lucas in The Addams Family earlier this year. The Diary Of Anne Frank will be Connor's first production with Kucom Theatre and a real dramatic push for his acting skill.



Vicky Bobeldyk: Mrs. Frank

Vicky has worked as an acting coach, accent coach, costume designer and production manager. Her musical theatre experience includes: My Fair Lady, Victor/Victoria, Les Miserables, Sweet Charity, Singing in the Rain, I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change, Nunsense, Call Me Madam, Hairspray, Calamity Jane, Return To The Forbidden Planet and most recently Mary Poppins as Miss Andrew.

Tonight you see her in the role of Mrs. Frank, a role she has always wanted to play. In her spare time Vicky teaches at Triple Threat Theatre

Shae is 14years old and has been taking drama classes since she was 8. Shae absolutely loves drama and acting and dedicates a lot of her spare time to it. Shae is a Fame Talent School Drama & Musical Theatre student. She also has private drama lessons with Cheryl Peppin. This year she played the 'Wicked Witch' in the Fame Talent School production of Shrek JR and was a Cheerleader in '13 The Musical'. For the past 4 years Shae has been doing her Trinity College London Exams in 'Individual Acting Skills'. She has also attended school holiday drama

Paul Vander Loos: Mr. Dussel





- 1. "How wonderful it is that nobody need wait a single moment before starting to improve the world."
- 2. "It's really a wonder that I haven't dropped all my ideals, because they seem so absurd and impossible to carry out. Yet I keep them, because in spite of everything, I still believe that people are really good at heart."
- 3. "Think of all the beauty still left around you and be happy."
- 4. "I can shake off everything as I write; my sorrows disappear, my courage is reborn."
- 5. "I've found that there is always some beauty left -- in nature, sunshine, freedom, in yourself; these can all help you."
- 6. "No one has ever become poor by giving."
